PROJECT INFRASTRUCTURE DEVELOPMENT

The Company recently decided to fast track the Infrastructure Development Program and at the time of writing this article, two new classrooms and two new teacher's houses are being completed at Bonoabo. A big thank you must go to Mr. Amos Lai and his team at Dimbudo Builders. The new classrooms and teachers housing on Abau Island are now progressing well and our thanks must go to Mr. James Goli who is coordinating this work.

Within the next three months we hope to complete at least twenty new buildings which have been prefabricated and delivered to site. These include, teachers housing, classrooms, dormitories, medical and police facilities and accommodation at Bam just north of our new mill. We have in the last month been able to upgrade the access road to Oio village and the access road to Bam should now be completed. Unfortunately the weather has hampered our progress with village access roads to Segiri, Apaeva and Darava #2 and we hope to have these completed by the end of this year.

The Company has recently erected a series of weatherproof notice boards throughout the FMA, as a direct result of the transparency policy that we have adopted in relation to landowner issues in that, all grievances and demands from landowners shall be published together with the Company's response. Hopefully this initiative shall assist us in promoting goodwill and harmony within the FMA.

A CLASS ACT

One of the terms and conditions of the Cloudy Bay FMA Timber Permit is to build a number of classrooms and teachers houses at villages in the Forest Management Area. The timber for these buildings comes from Cloudy Bay FMA, is sawn at the local Sawmill, sent to the Nine Mile Wood Processing Center where it is treated and prefabricated. The building is then sent in kit form to the village. Builders from the community are employed to do the construction.
